

Welcome


White Cliffs Country is a unique English destination with glorious countryside and coastline, and incredible history Europe.

48 hours is not enough time to experience White Cliffs Country, but this will give you some inspiration to get started.

DAY ONE

Immerse yourself in history at Dover Castle and experience the royal court of Henry II or travel deep into the White Cliffs and visit the Wartime Tunnels. After a spot of lunch, take advantage of a free guided walk and explore one of our many walks and trails with a volunteer greeter.

For the more adventurous, take to the water and see the famous White Cliffs of Dover from a boat. At the end of your busy day try one of our great places to eat and relax, with a range of locally sourced produce, you won't be disappointed.

DAY TWO

Soak up some café culture and shopping in Deal. The colourful seafront, seen best whilst taking a stroll along the pier, plays host to a wide choice of excellent pubs and restaurants. Wander through the High Street and explore fantastic small, independent shops and delicatessens.

Head along to Sandwich and discover one of the most intact, historic medieval towns in the country. Take a tour of the 16th century Guildhall or follow the town trail, much of which runs alongside the River Stour. From here you can take the River Bus and see the seals. For afternoon tea and the beauty of a formal garden, once enjoyed by Jane Austen, take a short drive into the countryside to Goodnestone Park Gardens. Haven't found time to fit it all in? Then stay a little longer!



Dover

Dover town nestles under the shadow of its magnificent castle. The busy port boasts some wonderful hidden gems. Dover Museum and from Market Square is the Roman Painted House - a fine example of a Roman house in Britain.

St James Retail Park, with shops, cafes, restaurants and a six-screen cinema, is in the heart of the town centre. Surrounding streets are home to a wide variety of shops, cafes, restaurants, bars and pubs and sites of historical and architectural interest.

Once a leading destination for Victorian pleasure-seekers, Dover seafront is still a beautiful area to stroll, with it's fine architecture, marina, pier and magnificent views. Take in the panorama of the English Channel, the harbour, port and White Cliffs. You may be tempted to take a daytrip to France on one of the regular ferry sailings – don't forget



Deal

Walk to the modern award-winning building at the end of Deal's 1000ft long pier and look back at a view that has hardly changed in over a century. The modern café, Deal Pier Kitchen, located at the end of the pier featured in The Times' top 30 best beach cafes and restaurants in 2020.

Deal was recently rated the best seaside resort out of 91 resorts in the UK and its unspoilt seafront, full of dangerous smuggling haunts in the 1800's, is now a wonderful collection of colourful buildings complemented by the fishing boats hauled up onto the shingle beach giving it a unique vista.

A short stroll from the seafront you will find the Timeball Tower Museum, Deal Museum, churches, houses and pubs and the narrow lanes around historic Middle Street. You're not the first to enjoy the charm of this town though - Lord Horatio Nelson himself entertained Lady Emma Hamilton at the Royal Hotel, where you can still dine and stay. Why not also indulge yourself at the many wonderful tea shops or browse around quaint gift shops, art galleries and antique emporiums.



Sandwich

This beautiful ancient town is said to be one of the most well-preserved medieval towns in Britain. Built in 1579, the Guildhall dominates the Market Square that was first a corn market and then a cattle market and still has a weekly Thursday market. In 1255, the first captive elephant was at Sandwich quayside, it was then taken on foot to the King's menagerie in the Tower of London.

It is well worth a wander down the newly refurbished quayside to Fisher Gate - dating from 1384 and one of the two surviving original medieval for the bridge.

Food has always been associated with the town – in the 18th century the Earl of Sandwich is reputed to have devised the popular snack, and this is celebrated in the annual food fayre. There are many pubs, restaurants

Getting to White Cliffs Country

It's easy to travel here from London and mainland Europe. Dover, Deal, Sandwich and our villages and countryside are serviced by regular trains and buses both locally and to and from London.

- 63 minutes by high-speed train from London St Pancras, Stratford International and Ebbsfleet International
- Mainline stations at Dover, Martin Mill, Walmer, Deal and Sandwich
- 90 minutes from Calais, France on a cross-channel ferry
- 35 minutes from Calais, France by Eurotunnel, then a 10-minute drive from the terminal
- M20 and M2 motorways link us to the rest of the UK

Coach and minibus parking

Dover District Council car parks have a length restriction of 5.55 metres including a towbar, a height restriction of 2.50 metres including any roof rack or luggage box, and a width restriction of 2.10 metres including any wing mirrors. If your minibus exceeds any of these restrictions, coach parking is available at the following sites:

- Maison Dieu Car Park, Dover Dover Castle Hill Car Park
- Prince of Wales Terrace, Deal Deal Beach Street, Deal
- The Strand, Walmer Ash Road, Sandwich The Quay, Sandwich

Please note that some of these bays are designated for sole coach use in the summer only - see signs close by for clarification.
