Explore miles of wonderful walking and cycling trails, lovely parks, gardens, nature reserves, internationally important habitats and a world-class wildlife park.



History brought to life


Forts and fortresses

Explore the magnificent fortresses of White Cliffs Country: three jewels in the crown of Kent's Heritage Coast and the keyholders to the treasure trove of England's history.

Find a symbol of the spirit of resistance, a home of royalty through the ages and sites of extraordinary military importance.









Visit the new Kent Mining Museum which reveals the industrial past of White Cliffs Country, once home to Kent's biggest colliery.

See the working water mill that helped defend Britain against Napoleonic invasion. Explore the lighthouse where Marconi sent his first shore-to-ship radio message. Discover the industries and communities supported by coast and country.



Magnificent Dover

This small but mighty town at the heart of Kent's Heritage Coast with the iconic spectacular White Cliffs and the unmissable landmark of Dover Castle is a Cinque Port, home to the Bronze Age Boat, a Roman lighthouse, a Roman Painted House and a medieval hospital (now the Maison Dieu)!

Follow the town trail to visit the many beautiful and historic buildings and stop off in one of the friendly cafes and bars. Sample a locally brewed craft ale in a Grade 2 listed inn. Stroll along the seafront to the Marina Curve and out onto the pier. Hire bikes and explore the parks and gardens, and the surrounding countryside.

Take a boat trip out into the English Channel where you'll get the best views of this amazing town.







A quaint and quintessentially English seaside town, Deal is often hailed as one of the best places to live in the UK and it's easy to see why. One of the prettiest seaside towns in Kent, it's a tiny but terrific gem with an award-winning high street of independent shops and a past almost as colourful as the buildings that line the seafront.

A former smuggling haunt, Deal boasts a town centre full of character, with independent shops, bars and cafes, a beautiful seafront and an eye-catching pier.

Wander through winding streets and alleyways, join a historic tour to discover the town's secret history, stroll along the seafront, stop for ice cream and decide where you're going to eat next.


Medieval Sandwich

It may no longer be by the sea, but this beautiful town has prestigious origins as one of the most important ports in England and is one of the famous Cinque Ports. Boasting medieval buildings at every turn and full of romantic charm, the town's street plan has not changed much since the 10th century. Be sure to visit the Guildhall Museum, home to Sandwich's 1300 AD Magna Carta and Charter of the Forest.

Cruise from the quayside for a marine wildlife encounter aboard the River Runner or board a Cold War-era gunboat boasting Hollywood connections. Browse antique shops for curios, refuel at one of the many cafes, bars and restaurants. Discover more about the fascinating history of Sandwich with a guided tour of the town or a medieval workshop.

Getting to White Cliffs Country

It's easy to travel here from London and mainland Europe. Dover, Deal, Sandwich and our villages and countryside are serviced by regular trains and buses both locally and to and from London.

- 63 minutes by high-speed train from London St Pancras, Stratford International and Ebbsfleet International
- 90 minutes from Calais, France on a cross-channel ferry
- 35 minutes from Calais, France by Eurotunnel, then a 10-minute drive from the terminal
- M20 and M2 motorways link us to the rest of the UK.
